



Charmed by Jen Calonita


The Classy Crooks Club by Alison Cherry


Dragonborn by Toby Forward


Defender of the Realm by Mark Huckerby & Nick Ostler






The Isle of the Lost by Melissa De La Cruz


The Lost Frost Girl by Amy Wilson


The Lost Property Office by James R. Hannibal


The Maze of Bones by Rick Riordan


Pip Bartlett's Guide to Magical Creatures by Jackson **Pierce & Maggie Stiefvater**


The Shadows by Jacqueline West


Across the Dark Water by Jennifer Lynn Alvarez


Snow & Rose by Emily Winfield Martin
