


Beautiful Creatures by Kami Garcia




Dead Upon A Time by Elizabeth Paulson




Five Night's At Freddy's by Scott Cawthon

Four Dead Queens by Astrid Scholte



The first fully illustrated version to use the original 1818 text, this handsome volume is destined to capture the imagination of those new to the story as well as those who know it well.






Girl, Stolen by April Henry



Gone by Michael Grant



The Good Demon by Jimmy Cajoleas




Can a boy raised by ghosts face the wonders and terrors of the worlds of both the living and the dead?



Miss Peregrine's Home for Peculiar Children by Ransom Riggs






Weregirl by C.D. Bell


