


Amber Brown is Not a Crayon by Paula Danziger


A Boy Called Christmas by Matt Haig


I Survived The Great Molasses Flood, 1919 by Lauren Tarshis

Lara's Gift by Annemarie O'Brien




Little Women by Louisa May Alcott




My Side of the Mountain by Julie Craighead George


A Night Divided by Jennifer A. Nielsen
