



# The Chocolate Touch by Patrick Skene Catling


# Cloudy with a Chance of Boys by Megan McDonald


### The Dirt Diary by Anna Staniszewski


### The Dragonology Handbook by Ernest Drake


# Keep It Together, Keiko Carter by Debbi Michiko Florence


# Lety Out Loud by Angela Cervantes


### My Big Fat Zombie Goldfish by Mo O'Hara
