





Ben Franklin's In My Bathroom by Candace Fleming


Dragon Rider by Cornelia Funke




The Great Animal Escapade by Jane Kerr




***How To Make Money For Kids* by Scholastic**

With this practical guide, kids can discover how to earn money, save it, and make it grow.




***The Invention of Hugo Cabret* by Brian Selznick**


***Love, Aubrey* by Suzanne LaFleur**




***Old Yeller* by Fred Gipson**


Shadows of Sherwood by Kekla Magoon


The Storm Runner by J. C. Cervantes


Tinker Bell and the Great Fairy Rescue by Kimberly Morris
