






Miss Mary is Scary by Dan Gutman




The Legend of Rock, Paper, Scissors by Adam Rex


The Alien Next Door: The New Kid by A.I. Newton






Dragons Love Tacos by Adam Rubin



Judy Moody Was In A Mood by Megan McDonald



We're All Wonders by R.J. Palacio




Raptors! The Nastiest Dinosaurs by Don Lessem






Dog Man: Lord of the Fleas by Dav Pilkey








What Do You Do With A Tail Like This by Steve Jenkins


Tumble Bumble by Felicia Bond






Let's Play, Crabby! by Jonathan Fenske






