



Defender of the Realm by Mark Huckerby & Nick Ostler


A Duet for Home by Karina Yan Glaser




I Survived: Hurricane Katrina, 2005 by Lauren Tarshis




Link + Hud: Sharks & Minnows by Jarrett & Jerome Pumphrey (ARC)


The Miraculous Journey of Edward Tulane by Kate DiCamillo


The Serpent's Secret by Sayantani Dasgupta


The Sun and the Star by Rick Riordan & Mark Oshiro


The Swiss Family Robinson by Johann David Wyss
