


Planet Earth Collection by National Geographic Kids






Super Narwhal and Jelly Jolt by Ben Clanton



Jabari Jumps by Gaia Cornwall








Miss Brown is Upside Down by Dan Gutman






Pug Blasts Off by Kyla May





A warm and lively tale about the river otter, an animal that lives in many of America's waterways. Illustrated by James Melvin.






How Do Dinosaurs Say Good Night? by Jane Yolen & Mark Teague






Fact Tracker: Horse Heros by Mary Pope Osborne




