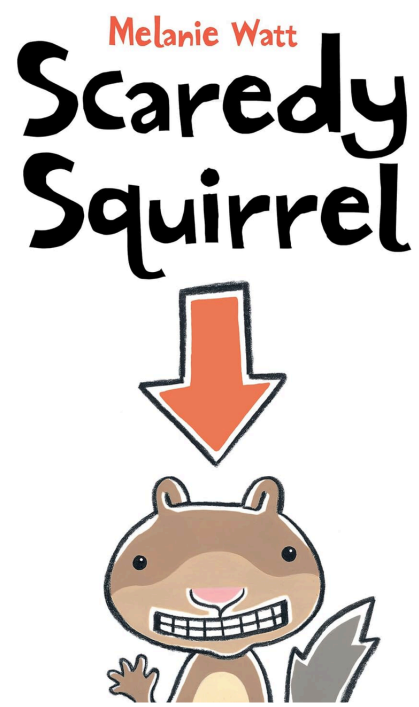




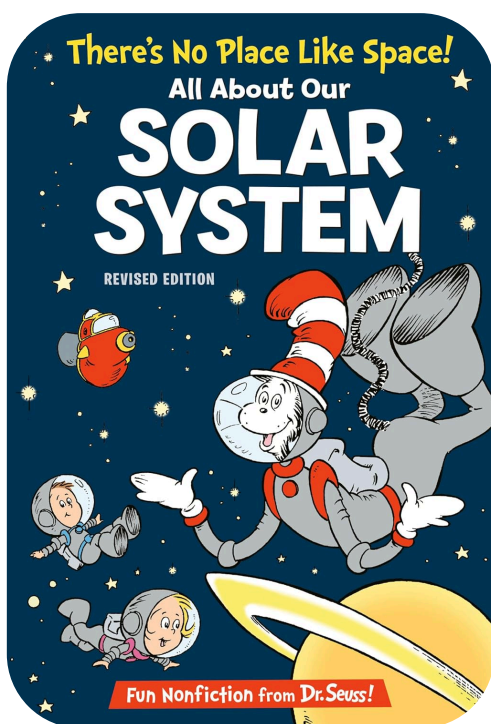
OCTOBER KIDS' BOOK BAG BOOK CHOICES

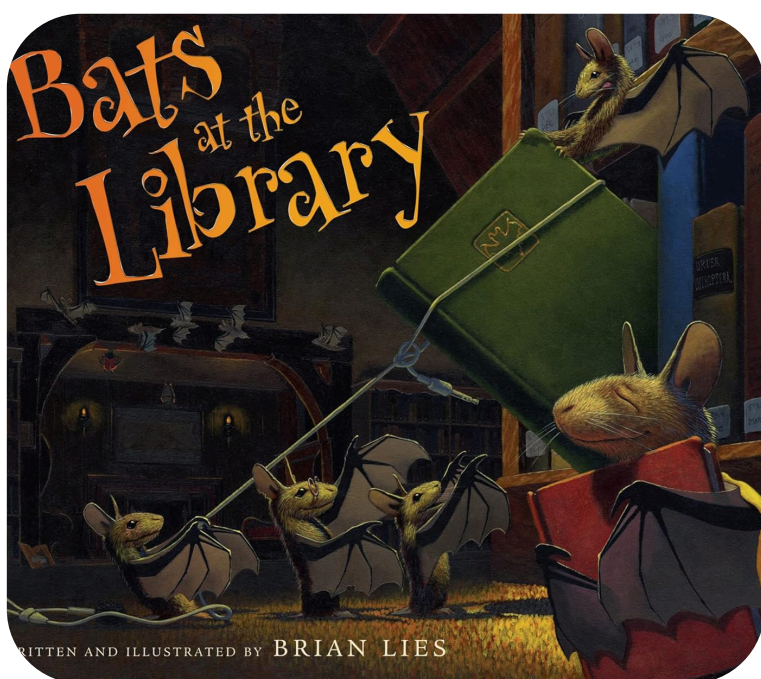

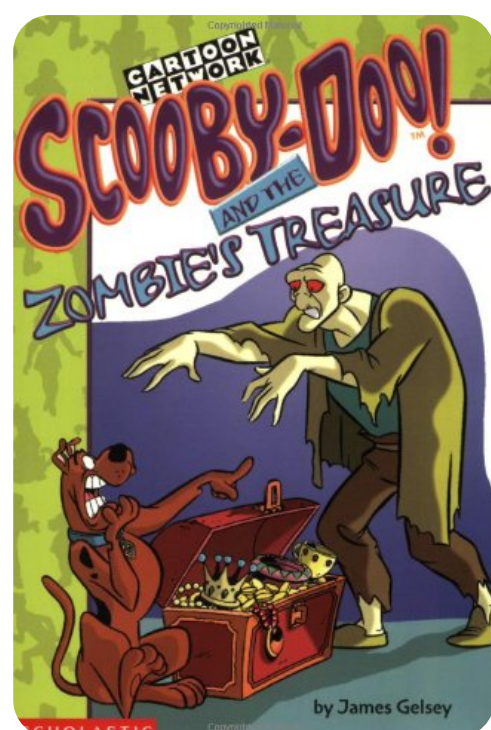

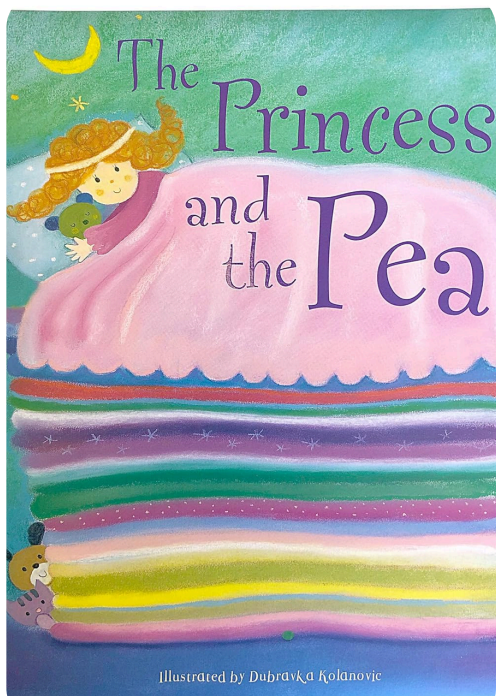
Poppy's Big Day! Trolls World Tour

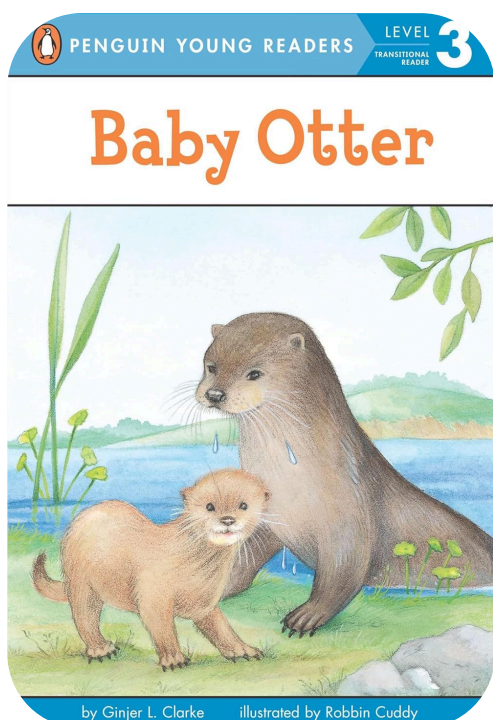

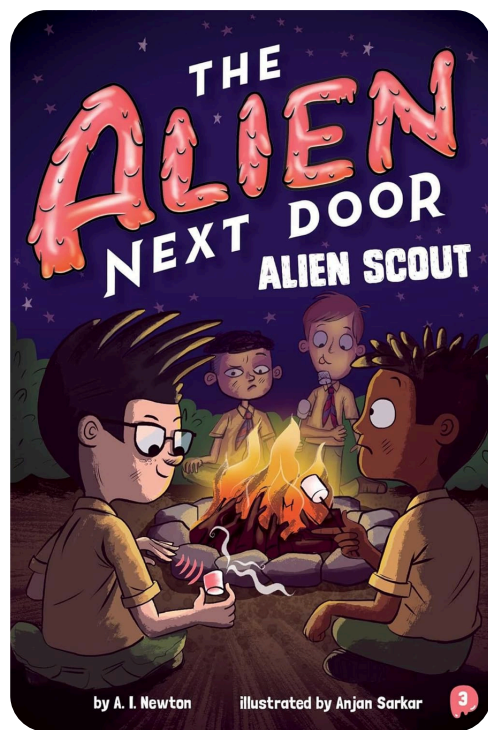
***Non-Fiction Level 3**

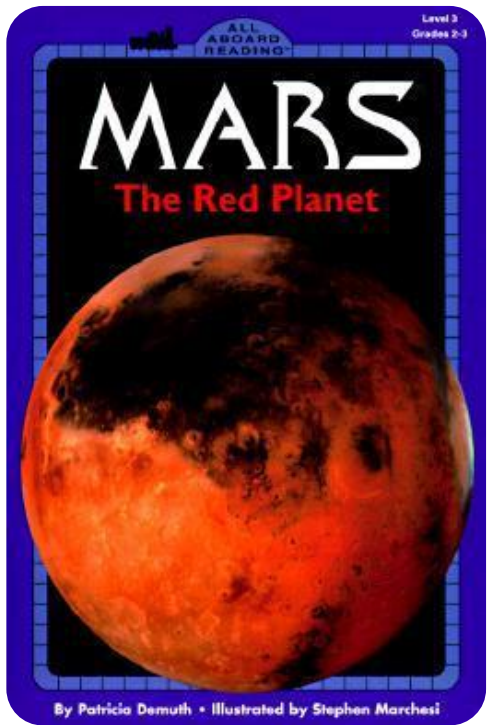
The Office: A Day at Dunder Mifflin Elementary by Robb Pearlman

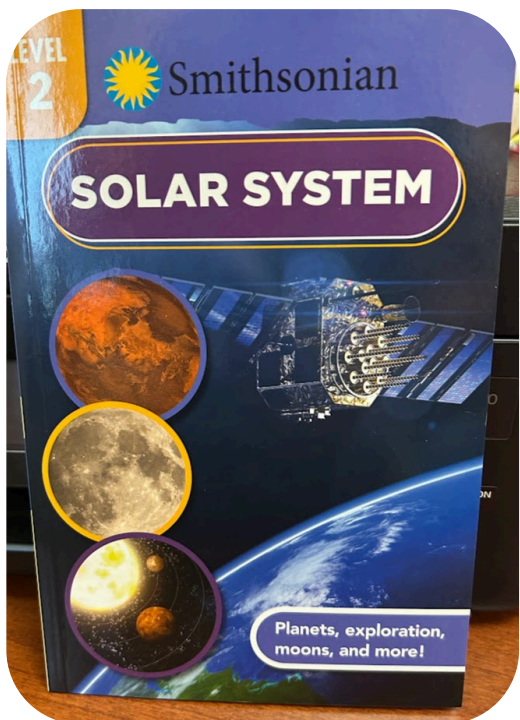

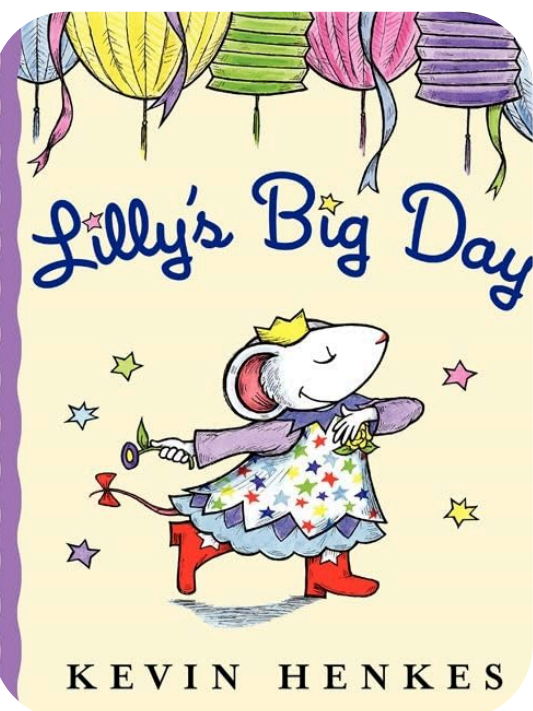

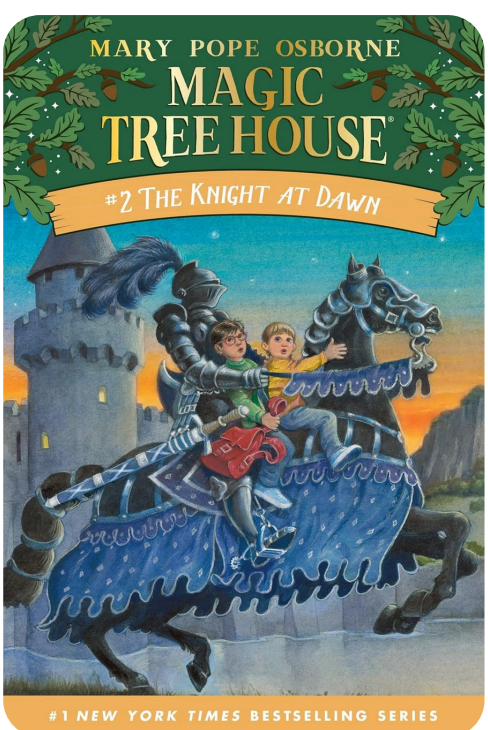
***Non-fiction Level 2**

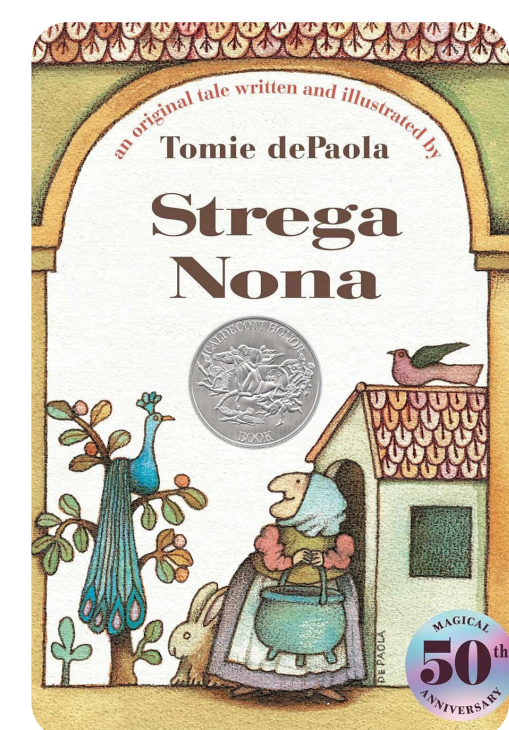

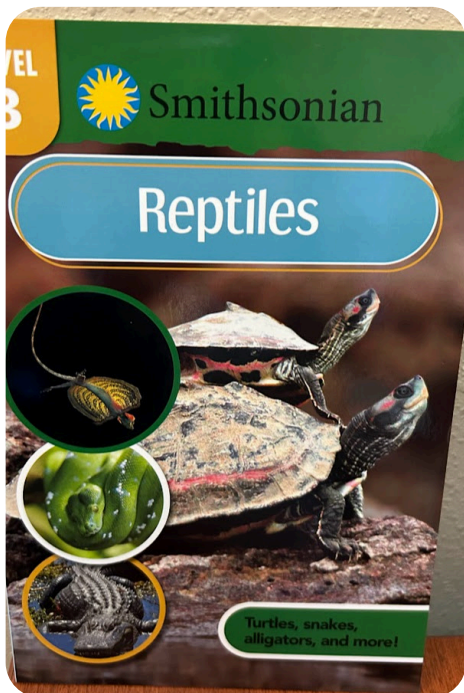
Strega Nona by Tomie de Paola

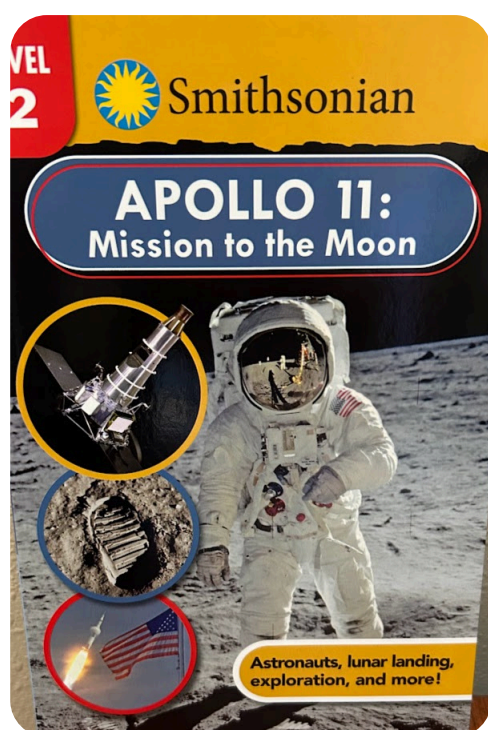

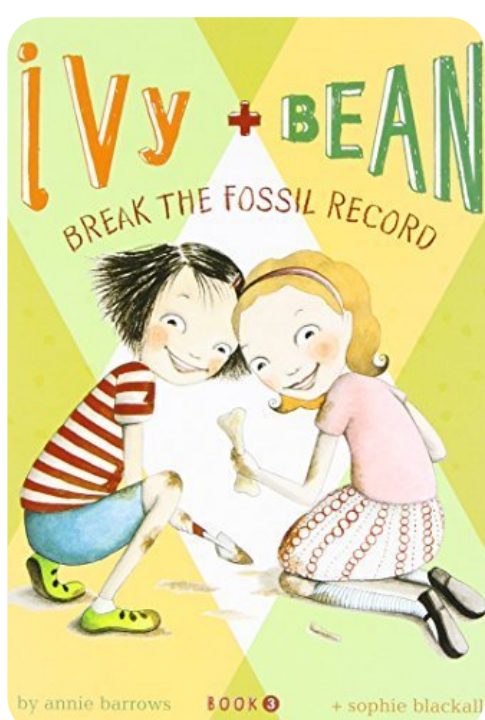
