


The Alien Next Door: Aliens for Dinner by A.I. Newton




Thanksgiving on Thursday by Mary Pope Osborne






The Legend of the Indian Paintbrush by Tomie dePaola





Charlie and the Christmas Kitty by Ree Drummond








Jingle Bells, Batman Smells! by Barbara Park










Smithsonian: Sharks by Brenda Royce






